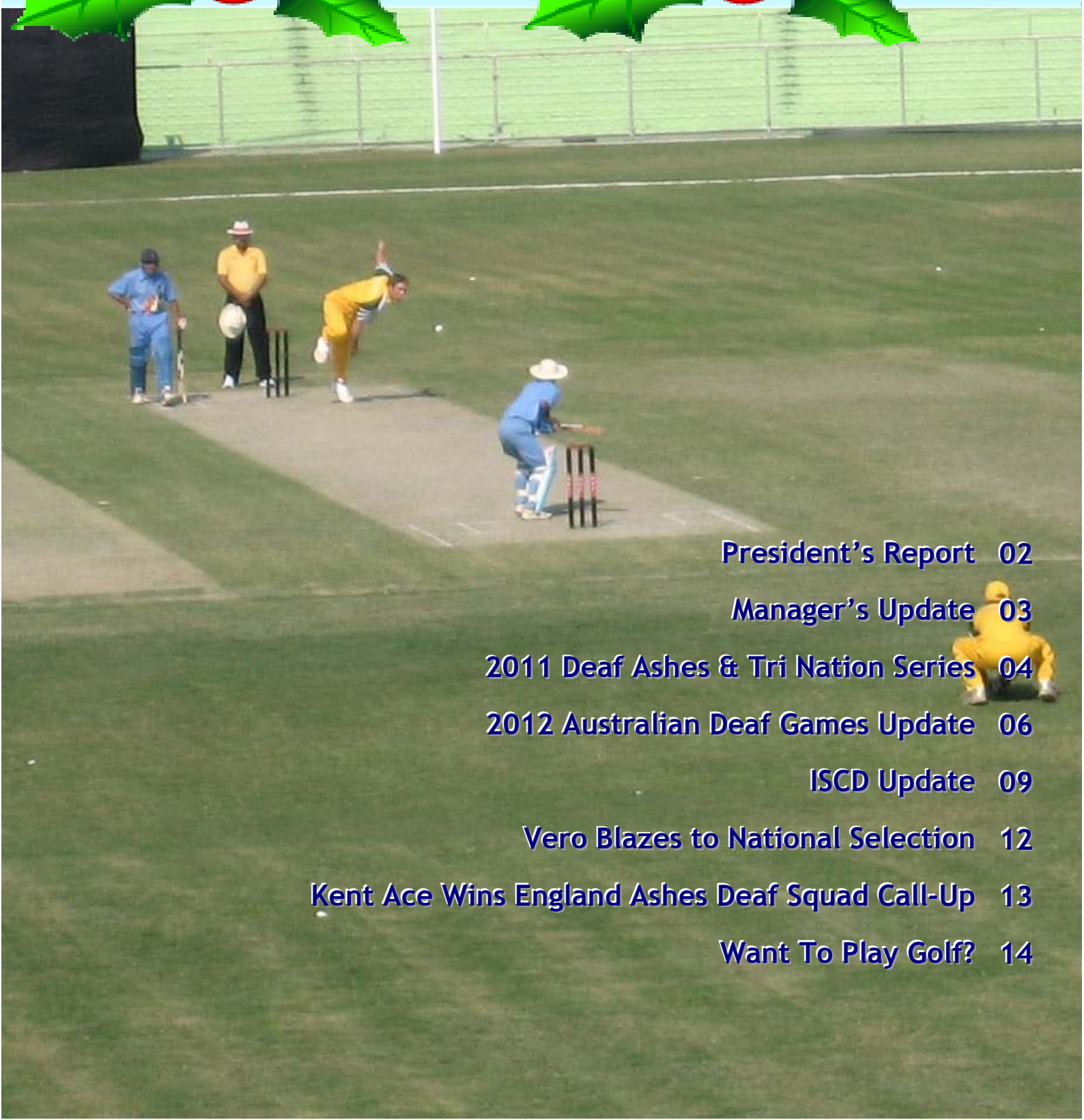

- The Sports Entry Fees are currently being finalised and will be released over the coming weeks as we work with each sport and venue to lock in final costs; and
- A comprehensive list of accommodation options is included in this eNews. We urge you to book accommodation as soon as possible.

DSA is also pleased to be involved in the planning for the first-ever Deaf Cricket Tri-Series, in partnership with Cricket Australia, Deaf Cricket Australia and the Lords Taverners. The Tri-Series will take place at Geelong Grammar, Victoria during 15 - 28 January 2011, featuring Australia, England and South Africa. The full schedule of matches can be found in this eNews. Go along and watch our cricketers in action, particularly the exciting Twenty20 double-header on Australia Day!

### 2011 Winter Deaflympics to Proceed

The 2011 Winter Deaflympics in Slovakia will proceed as scheduled, Tiffany Granfors—International Committee of Sports for the Deaf (ICSD) Chief Executive Officer —announced today with full approval from the ICSD Executive Board. Athletes, coaches, fans, and other supporters are encouraged to make plans to attend these games, headquartered in Vysoké Tatry, Slovakia, to be held during 18-26 February 2011.



Stated Granfors, "My recent trip to Slovakia showed me that the organizing committee has made great strides in ensuring that all sports venues, lodging facilities, and transportation services will be available during the Winter Deaflympics." ICSD had previously taken the unprecedented step of putting the Slovakian Organizing Committee on notice for failing to meet certain deadlines pertinent in the hosting of a Deaflympics. "While some financial issues remain for the organizing committee," Granfors added, "the average athlete or fan should not notice any difference in the Winter Deaflympics experience. ICSD has developed a reputation of putting on stellar Winter and Summer Deaflympics over the past decade and we wanted to ensure that this tradition continues. I am looking forward to a successful 17th Winter Deaflympics in Slovakia this coming February!"

The recognized member of the International Olympic Committee, ICSD organizes Winter and Summer Deaflympics in conjunction with local organizing committees. The upcoming Winter Deaflympics will consist of five sports: Alpine Skiing, Cross Country Skiing, Curling, Ice Hockey, and Snowboarding. ### ICSD appoints Sports Recruitment International to lead global search for new Chief Executive Officer

The International Committee for Sport for the Deaf (ICSD) has retained Sports Recruitment International to lead a global search to find their new Chief Executive Officer who will lead the further implementation of their ambitious strategic plan.

The ICSD is the international governing body responsible for all deaf sports. It counts 104 national deaf sports federations as its members and is a recognized member of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as well as SportAccord (see also [www.deaflympics.com](http://www.deaflympics.com)).

Under the leadership of Craig Crowley, who was elected President of the ICSD in 2009, and the executive board, the ICSD has developed an ambitious strategic plan for 2010 to 2013 that includes major objectives as building organizational strength as well as increasing marketing prominence.

The ICSD's largest events, the Summer and Winter Deaflympics are among the world's fastest growing sports events. More than 4,000 deaf athletes and officials from 77 nations participated in the 21st Summer Deaflympics in Taipei, Chinese Taipei, in September 2009. And over 600 athletes and officials participated in the 16th Winter Deaflympics in Salt Lake City, United States in February 2007.

Craig Crowley commented: "We expect the new Chief Executive Officer to play a key role in the development of our organization by giving direction and leadership within the framework of the ambitious strategic plan. He or she will work with our Board and a small team to develop existing policies as well as new partnerships to support the development of sport for the deaf and our global events. We expect the new CEO to bring us his or her experience in working with international or national sports governing

bodies and to help us develop our organisation, our events and our network of partners at the benefit of the sports for the deaf".

The ICSD announced in October of this year that Tiffany Granfors, Chief Executive Officer, has decided to leave the organization after 10 years of loyal service, effective after the 2011 Winter Deaflympics in Slovakia.

Michael Platen, the partner of Sports International Recruitment who will lead this search out of Lausanne, added: "We are very excited by this collaboration. The ICSD is not a rich federation but has an enormous legacy from having organised the first games for disabled athletes back in 1924, when it was still called "the Silent Games". They are a recognized member of the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as well as SportAccord. It is a very interesting opportunity for both the individual who will take this role, and the ICSD to write new pages in their history, with an excellent potential for development."

The 17th Winter Deaflympics will be held in February 2011 in Vysoké Tatry, Slovakia, and Greece, will host the 22nd Summer Deaflympics in August 2013. Vancouver, Canada, will host the 18th Winter Deaflympics in February 2015.

ICSD is pleased to announce that Miha ZUPAN of Slovenia and Anna TOVSTA of Ukraine have been selected as the 2010 WIDEX Sportsman and Sportswoman of the Year by the members of International Committee of Sports for the Deaf Selections Commission through electronic ballot. They earned 60 and 45 points respectively.

Miha ZUPAN, born 13 September 1982, was selected to be on the Slovenia national basketball team and participated in the recent 2010 FIBA World Basketball Championships in Turkey. His team reached to Quarterfinals and placed 8th, which was a huge success for his country. He was a reserved player early on and became a power forward starter for the remaining of the Championships. Miha received a professional contract for two years with the St. Petersburg in the SuperLeague A in Russia and will also play in Europe Cup ULEB this season.

Anna TOVSTA, born 15 December 1991, whose achievement includes six (6) gold and one silver in swimming at the recent 10th European Deaf Swimming Championships in Dortmund, Germany. Her results had also brought her four (4) European Championships records. Anna's accomplishments are listed as below:

# Vero Blazes trail to National Selection

THE Ashes might be slipping away but Newcastle's Adam Vero has the opportunity to save some face for his nation when the Australian Deaf Cricket team host England next month.

Vero is believed to be the first Novocastrian to gain selection in the Australian deaf squad.



Australia will face England in a three-day Test match from January 17 in Geelong, followed by two 50-over and two Twenty20 games against the English and South Africa.

The 35-year-old was selected for the 15-man Australian squad after his performances for NSW last April at the state-based Webby's Cup in Queensland.

Vero finished the tournament with an average of 42.50, which included an unbeaten 60 off 90 balls against Victoria White.

The innings, part of an opening stand of 122 with Terrigal-Matcham's Grant Thomson, helped secure a 10-wicket victory for NSW.

"I have dreamed about playing cricket for Australia since I was 10," Vero said.

"My goals for the upcoming series are to be selected in the starting Test team to play England and to play as many of the ODIs and T20 matches as possible."

As part of his selection, Vero will attend training sessions in the next month at Waitara Oval, Hornsby which have been organised by Australian skipper and Sydney Northern District first-grader Kym Daley.

Vero, who is the younger brother of former Newcastle representative batsman Jason, was born profoundly deaf and has worn hearing aids since he was 12 months old.

In 2005 he was fitted with a cochlear implant.

The Cardiff junior is a member of the Western Suburbs C5 City and Suburban side, which features other hearing impaired cricketers.

Fellow NSW batsman David Cuthel is the Wests C5 captain and a delegate for the NSW Deaf Cricket Association.

"We have been playing in the C&S comp for approximately 13 years, picking up some new deaf or hard-of-hearing players on the way," Cuthel said.

"But we are looking for more players if they are out there." Cuthel said Vero's selection in the Australian side had inspired his teammates.

"This is an exciting thing for Newcastle deaf players. As far as I know Adam is the first deaf or hard-of-hearing player from Newcastle to represent Australia," he said.

## Kent Ace wins England Ashes deaf squad call-up

STEFAN Pichowski of Kent has been included in England's Deaf Squad for their Ashes series in January.

The squad will play one Test match during the Ashes Series for Deaf Cricketers, followed by two one-day internationals and three Twenty20 matches as part of a tri-series against Australia and South Africa in Geelong.

Ian Martin, ECB National Disability Cricket manager, said: "Everyone involved in deaf cricket in England is looking forward to the forthcoming series and the challenge that playing against Australia in Australia brings.

"The last Ashes series for Deaf Cricketers was very close and we are looking forward to a well-fought contest. We are also looking forward to the tri-series involving South Africa, whom we have not faced for a few years.

"We have some new faces in the squad and a new, but experienced, coaching team with the opportunity to bring two titles home. The squad are well prepared and ready for the challenges that lie ahead."

England will be looking to win back the trophy, currently held by Australia, after their last encounter in 2008 ended in a draw. The Ashes Series for Deaf Cricketers date back to the early 1990s, which signalled the start of the May/Craven Trophy for the winners and was the forerunner to the first Deaf World Cup in 1996.
